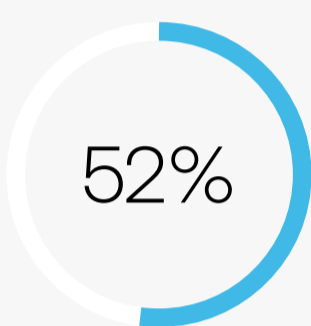

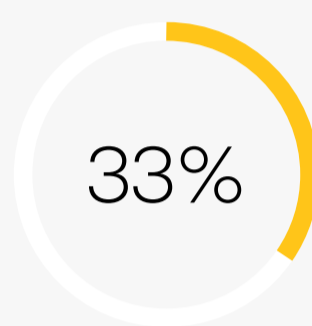
Outdated tech is holding healthcare back



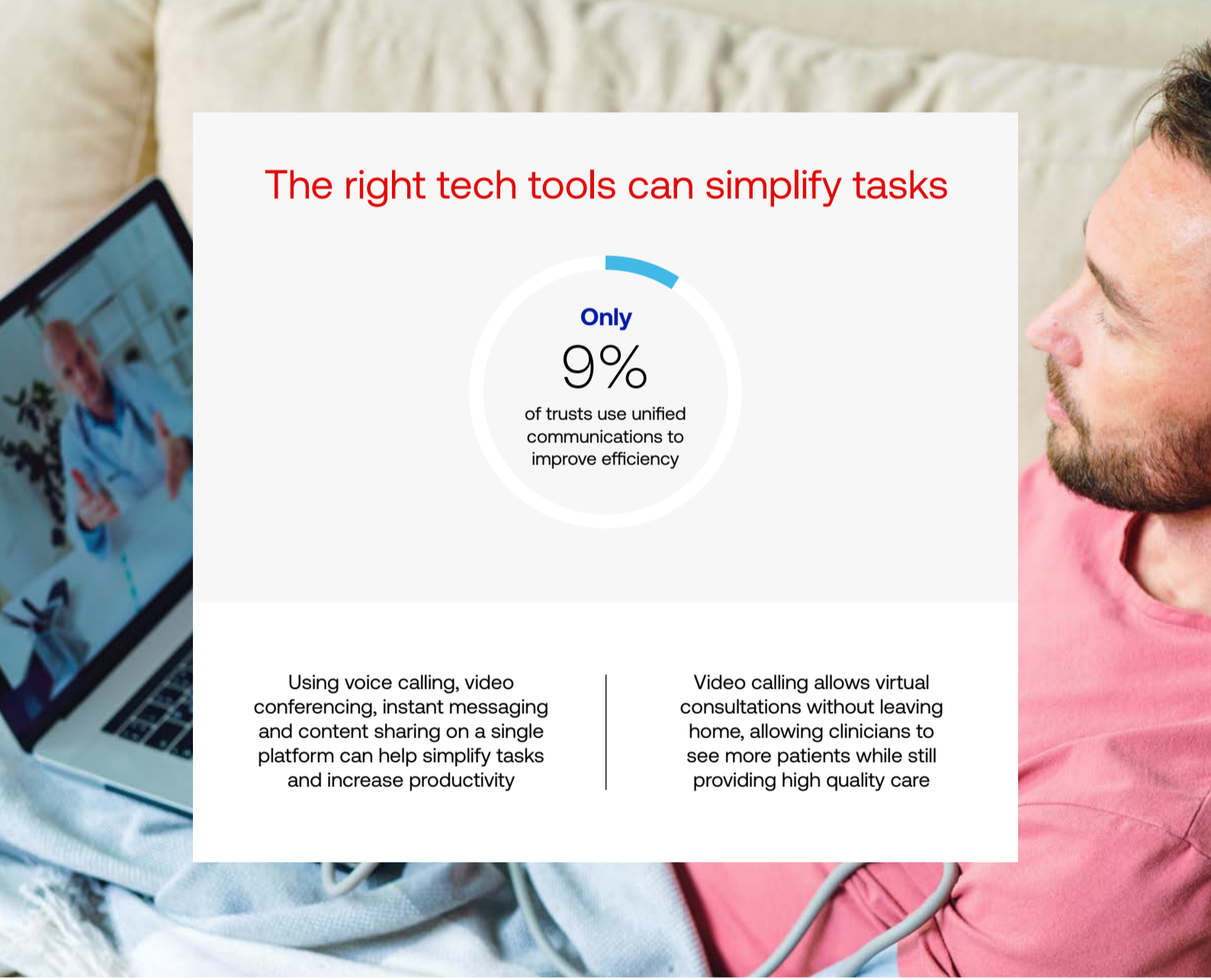
of respondents said their trust had some element of inefficient technology

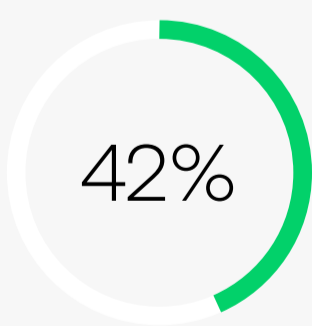
Using voice calling, video conferencing, instant messaging and content sharing on a single platform can help simplify tasks and increase productivity

Video calling allows virtual consultations without leaving home, allowing clinicians to see more patients while still providing high quality care

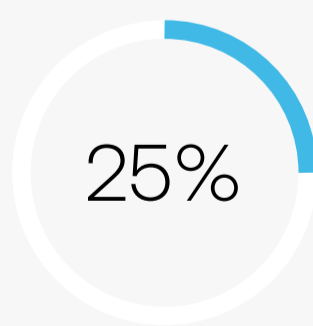
